

## Gregory Foxworth

Gregory Foxworth has been at Texas A&M University since 1987. As an assistant vice president for research, Foxworth is responsible for the Office of Research Policy and Development Support, which includes oversight of all University research policies, technology transfer interactions, internal grants program, limited submission proposals and export control and developmental activities. He became director of the Office of Sponsored Projects (OSP) in 1994, and his responsibilities included reviewing and approving externally funded university research proposals, negotiating research contracts and grants, and administration of university intellectual property including inventions, patents, copyrights, and technology-mediated instructional projects. Foxworth was appointed assistant vice president for research and director of OSP in 2003. From September 2003 to January 2004, Foxworth served as the first director of the Office of Proposal Development, which develops large multi-institutional/multi-investigator center grants. In 1980, upon completing his MBA degree, Foxworth accepted a position in First National Bank of Dallas' Professional Development Program. From 1982 to 1986, he worked at North American Philips Consumer Electronics Corporation as a Marketing/Financial Analyst with the Philco Marketing Group and Philips New Product Development Group. In 1987 Foxworth served as the administrator to the University of Tennessee's Biology Consortium, the biology division of the Science Alliance.

Foxworth is a member of the National Council of University Research Administrators (NCURA); the Society of Research Administrators (SRA), where he served as president of the Texas State Chapter from FY2005 and FY2006; the Association of University Technology Managers (AUTM); and the Texas Technology Transfer Association, where he served as board president in 1993. He has served as Region 5 Representative on the NCURA's National Publications Committee, and NCURA's National Nominating and Leadership Development Committee. Foxworth has served as Texas A&M's representative to the Federal Demonstration Partnership Texas Research Executives Committee. He is currently Texas A&M's representative to the Congress on Government Relations and the Association of University Technology Managers.
